Framfield CE Primary School

Last term we had a very exciting time. The focus for the school is on Artists and Musicians, and this linked into work on the Ashdown Project. This is a project set up by the Village Schools Association to develop oral story-telling skills. We spent a wonderful morning in the Ashdown Forest on a very bright, sunny and cold morning. It was a rare experience for the children to see icicles and frozen ponds, and to study the beautiful frost patterns which covered branches and leaves. On our return to school the children worked on telling stories based on what they had seen in the Forest. They invented stories about the Fir People, about monsters that live in the forest and used the motifs of fairy stories with magical fir cones and stones. Since then they have presented their stories to the school, and year 6 have made films of their story-telling.

The next stage of this project was an art week when each child did drawings based on their memories of their walk through the Forest. From these drawings they made clay tiles which will be installed on the front wall of the school. These were individual pieces of work, but they also worked together to produce two weavings which represent different aspects of the forest. In addition we have a film of our day at the Forest made by a professional photographer who spent the day with us -a brilliant record of a very fine day.

The children have learned a great deal about different artists and musicians, including Picasso, Saudi, Van Gogh, Beethoven, Mozart and Elgar. They were entertained by the Hand Cross Park School Orchestra; they spent the day learning African drumming and are soon to spend another day with a jazz musician. Another art day will be spent by Keystage 2 children on the work of Surrealist artists to provide a contrast to their work so far. They have written hymns and composed musical accompaniment which will be performed at our Easter Service on 30th March.

We are delighted to be enjoying so much fine weather so far this term, as our school topic is called 'Fitness Factory'. We have many sports and games activities planned, including work with teachers from UCTC. In addition we have many parents coming to share their favourite exercise with us. Later in the term we will be focusing on the contents of a balanced diet and have some interesting things planned to do with food - more next time! Janet Wilde Headteacher



The Parish Council met on Tuesday, 27 March and 24 April 2007 (the last meeting of the 'current' Council).

The issue of the closure of Framfield Post Office was again discussed with the compulsory closure information from the Government not now expected until the end of May.

The public meeting to discuss proposals to place a Pavilion on both Framfield Blackboys recreation grounds was a success and further investigations are now taking place. The final decision will be made once a 'new' Council is in position.

At the April meeting PCSO Nick Arthur reported on the successful day the Police had in Uckfield offering to fit tamper-proof bolts to car number plates as the incidence of number plate theft is increasing. The bolts are free and if anyone would be interested please contact either myself or Uckfield Police Station, PCSO Nick Arthur. If enough residents were interested the PC could consider holding a bolt-fitting session in the Parish.

MACMILLAN CANCER SUPPORT

The street collection held in Uckfield in April raised £495 helping towards the services that Macmillan provide. Our committee are providing *Teas at Hobbs Barton on 2/3/4th June* when Valerie and Jeremy Clark once again open their garden under the National Gardens Scheme. Do try to go along and wander around, maybe buy some plants for your own garden and enjoy a cup of tea in the beautiful Barn.

With your help Macmillan have now appointed, among other services, a Head and Neck Clinical Nurse Specialist at Eastbourne DG. The 2007 approved bids include a Skin Cancer Specialist (there is an 11% higher risk of skin cancer if you live in Sussex) and a Speech and Language Therapist (patients often have to travel to London for this service). Also in 2006 Macmillan grants were issued to 126 people in East Sussex helping with travel costs, heating bills etc.

Following the positive result achieved by Macmillan's lobbying to allow cancer patients to travel into London for treatment and not pay the congestion charge, they have been lobbying Government again - this time to try to stop parking fees at hospitals for cancer patients.
