THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

We are all very much aware of the dangerous and almost impossible situation for our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan and reports are coming through almost daily of the numbers being killed and wounded. Not only do the families of those killed need our support but, many of the seriously wounded, with those losing limbs at such an early age, need our support as well and the Royal British Legion is totally involved in this vital need.

I have been the organiser, for 28 years, of the Parish Poppy Collection during the two weeks leading up to Remembrance Sunday each November and I have always been so grateful for my helpers' dedication - many for so long. I have at present 16 house-to-house collectors who are deployed to cover the Parish and I provide poppy trays at 12 static "businesses" within our boundary. Last year we achieved another very good result of £2,536 and we have exceeded £2,000 every year since 2001.

A very valuable contribution to our totals comes from "Home Collectors" who keep a collecting tin, which I supply, to absorb small change throughout the year. 19 are deployed at present in Parish homes and they added £291 to our total last autumn. I have mentioned before that I would so very much like to see a significant increase in this method and I would ask you to make a serious effort at this time to become another valuable member of our team. Those who already hold tins have these collected by me after Remembrance Sunday and receive a new tin for the following year. New "Home Collectors" can, of course, receive a tin from me and start a year's collecting at any time.

Please try hard to make an urgent contribution in this way and ring me <u>soon</u> on 01825 890208 or come and see me at Gate House Cottages, Framfield.





David Andrews asked if it were possible to hire the speed gun that is used in Ringmer. The Clerk was asked to look into the possibilities.

Reports from Representatives:

Blackboys Village Hall: Eryl Thomas reported that the electrician would be commencing work on 30 July 2007. Bookings still seemed to be good.

Memorial Hall: Keith Riddle reported that bookings are not good although the Farmers' markets have raised to date £1,200. There is £1,600 in the bank; £3,300 in savings and £4,200 of shares. Framfield - Rita Redman reported that the school holidays have started. The school took part in the go-karting competition in Uckfield.

WDALC: Ervl Thomas reported that he represents the PC in Cluster 3 on the Planning Panel.

Any Other Business at the Discretion of the Chairman

- Myran Eade commented on the outstanding list of jobs for Paul West including removing the graffiti from the bus shelters in Framfield, emptying the bins and fencing the allotments in Blackboys.
- Keith Riddle asked if there was to be any planning training for the PC from the other end of the spectrum, ie a planning consultant rather than WDC. Eryl Thomas remarked that he had a contact in Fletching.
- Maria Naylor asked if there was any news on the future of the PO. The Clerk replied that everyone was still awaiting the Government's news on the formal closure list.
- Ian Paisley stated that the Church Path needed attention.
- Eryl Thomas mentioned the Summer Show on Saturday. 11 August 2007, and that the PC will have its usual stall.

There were no declarations of personal and prejudicial interests in respect of items on the agenda. The minutes of the last meting held on 26 June 2007 were agreed as read. All matters arising were covered during the rest of the meeting.

Finance:

- Committee Report. Eryl Thomas reported that there had been a successful handover from Trina Hunt to Jan Kiddle and to John Jeffrey from where Norman Jones left off.
- Formal approval of the accounts for the year ending 31 March 2007 and Statement of
 Assurance in line with the audit regulations recommendation from Finance Committee.
 The accounts were unanimously accepted and formally proposed for agreement by Ian Paisley
 and seconded by Myran Eade. Those present subsequently formally endorsed the Statement of
 Assurance.
- Details of the July 2007 expenditure is available from the Clerk. The total expenditure for the month was £2.287.61.

Planning: Copies of all minutes are available from the Clerk.

Eryl Thomas commented that following on from the open forum on the LDF he suggested that the PC should take a pragmatic approach and would continue to oppose any development on Bird in Eye Hill but that some development in the villages would be inevitable. The PC should endeavour to work with the residents and District Council to obtain the best for the Parish. At least 40% of any development over nine houses would be affordable and efforts could be made to make sure that this has the local criteria attached.

Recreation Grounds (Parish Councillors as Trustees)

• Proposal to progress the provision of a Pavilion on both Framfield and Blackboys recreation grounds. All Councillors were in receipt of a report following on the site meeting with WDC senior planning officer, Doug Moss, which was thought to be very successful. Blackboys School are very keen. Following discussion Myran Eade proposed that the provision of pavilions on both recreation grounds be taken forward. This was seconded by Ian Paislev and agreed by the majority. Eryl Thomas stated that a further chance for publicity would be at the Summer Show where the PC will have its usual stand. A steering committee will then need to be organised.

Environment:

• Directional signs at Sharlands Corner. The Clerk reported that having spoken to both the owner of Tylers and Heathfield Parish Council who were both happy for directional signs to be erected indicating the way to the site the PC only had to agree that the Clerk could take the matter further. Mr Andrew Tyler has agreed to make a contribution towards the cost. The meeting agreed that the Clerk should continue with the Investigations,

CONSTANTINE CAMBALIOS.

Constantine Cambalios, Greek Anglophile, was born in Cairo on 20th March 1924. He died on July 17th 2007 aged 83.

Constantine "Costa" Cambalios came to live in Knightsbridge, London, and never returned to his home country.

He moved to Framfield in East Sussex, where he had found a house in an idyllic setting with a lake and large but overgrown grounds which he restored with great care. His home was closer to Newhaven where he had established a business and from which he retired on his 80th birthday.

Described in one eulogy as a man "of true integrity and kindness", Costa was widely regarded as a real gentleman to which his nickname "Lord Cambalios" bears testament.

Costa is survived by his wife, son, and his sister.

Thank you so much.




