At the AGM in May Maria Naylor was re-elected as Chairman with Rob Newton as Vice-Chairman. Jeff Goggin has taken over as Chairman of the Planning Committee with Peter Friend as his Deputy Chairman. Felicity Groves continues as the Emergency Planning Co-ordinator and Selina Allen as School Governor Representative for Framfield School and Ann Newton in the same position at Blackboys. Ian Paisley remains the Tree Warden.

The consultation has now been completed for the revised proposals for Blackboys High Street. We will await the outcome and then implementation of the works.

A review of the guidepost situation is underway with ESCC. The PC could not entertain formally adopting them unless they were brought up to a satisfactory specification.

ESCC are also conducting a survey of the grit bins in the Parish to endeavour to make sure that they are all in situ and full by the winter.

LIVING WITH FUR AND FEATHER

CAT AND DOG RELATIONSHIPS.

How true is the expression fighting like cat and dog? There are many different relationships between canines and felines. If cats and dogs are brought up together they are usually good friends. Some time ago I went to visit a family to give advice on training their puppy. They also had a kitten the same age. Watching these two play together was lovely. The kitten was a chunky British Blue, an ideal companion for the small puppy. I was entertained by a lively display of mock battles, wrestling, pouncing and chasing between these two well matched opponents.

My mother had a male Labrador called Noel who decided to adopt the family kitten. He would gently carry it about just like a mother cat would, and kept it washed and clean. He continued to do this even when the kitten grew up. Noel always looked after his companion. They would sit together by the fire thoroughly washing each others faces and were always the best of friends. Another example of a cat and dog friendship was rather unusual. Looking out of the kitchen window one day we saw a small white Terrier and a black cat. Rather surprised I went out to investigate. The cat immediately disappeared through the bushes, but the little friendly dog just stood there waiting. There was an address on his collar so we picked him up, popped him in the car and took him home. We explained that he had arrived with a cat but it had run off. The owner did not look at all surprised. Apparently the cat was always taking the dog off for a walk and would leave him with a neighbour to take home, while he went off to enjoy his feline pursuits before making his own way back.

Before I had Newfoundlands we had two Golden Retrievers. On one local walk there lived a very frail old cat that would come out of her cottage and walk stiffly and slowly into the middle of the narrow lane to enjoy a patch of sun that warmed her ancient bones and thread bare coat. The dogs were terrified of her and did not want to pass this frightening animal. All the old cat did was to stay still and glare at the dogs. Just that was enough to confirm her superior position. The two fit young dogs would reluctantly sidle past close to the hedge, looking extremely embarrassed, until they were clear and could enjoy their walk again.

On a visit to see an adolescent Collie cross that was very lively I was fascinated by the relationship between the dog and cat. The mature cat was quite tolerant and would let the young dog play with him. However after a while the youngster would get over excited and rough with the cat. I was a bit worried when I saw this. The owner

reassured me that the cat could handle the situation and said I must watch how the cat did it. In the corner of the room was a crate that the Collie slept in. The cat advanced towards its opponent. The dog backed away. The cat continued to manoeuvre the dog across the room all round the furniture until he was in front of the open door of the crate. One quick lunge at the dog's face made him back straight in. This clever cat had craftily captured his tiresome playmate. I thought the dog might try and come out, but the cat lay down blocking the entrance so the subdued Collie had to stay in there. The rest of my visit was very peaceful!

On another consultation I was visiting two feisty terriers who were great hunters. I always ask lots of questions about life style, routine, family members and other pets and if there are any other problems. I was told there was a problem between the two cats and these tough working terriers. I nodded my head wisely, knowing as I thought, the answer, that the poor cats were being terrorised by the dogs. How wrong I was. I was amazed to hear that it was the other way round. Both cats would attack the dogs, leaping on to their backs, digging their claws in and biting them! Luckily the two dogs had learnt to keep well away from these two fierce animals.

BLACKBOYS & DISTRICT HISTORICAL SOCIETY

In the past 15 years that the Society has been in existence there have been some momentous and extraordinary events that will forever stay in my memory. One such occasion was the recent ceremony at Blackboys Youth Hostel to unveil a commemorative plaque. I am sure that most readers of the Parish Magazine will know that the YHA building was originally built as a refuge for children fleeing from the Spanish Civil War in 1937. The day was special not only because it was held in a lovely location on a rare lovely sunny day this summer, but because of the stories of some very special people. The plague was unveiled by Moises and Miren Alonso who are both 85 years old and returned to Blackboys for the first time since arriving here in 1937 from Spain. This time, they brought members of their family with them. Miren said that when she arrived the first time she thought that she "was in Paradise". They both went to live in America and met again and fell in love several years later after writing to each other while Moises was fighting in the Korean War and they never forget their happy times as children in Blackboys. They were very grateful to the local people who helped and looked after them and the event was a reunion with people who they remembered as local children, as well as a family celebration. One of the original ideas behind setting up a history group in the Parish was to make sure that our local history was not forgotten, and also to show that although we are a small village in Sussex, we are affected by events that have happened all over the world.

There will not be a normal meeting in August but we will be having a Summer BBQ, weather permitting. On September 4th our speaker will be Peter Hill, his subject; Pills, Potions, and Patience.

Crimestoppers urges the public to "nail" metal thieves



Sussex Crimestoppers are joining forces with colleagues in Thames Valley, Kent, Hampshire and Isle of Wight, and Surrey to tackle metal theft crime head on in the South East.

Theft of metal is now one of the fastest rising crimes, with costs to the UK economy estimated at £770m each year. Heavily influenced by commodity prices and the growing economies of both developing and developed countries, it affects communities, industry and commerce and poses a real and significant threat to public safety and critical national infrastructure. It is an international problem and whilst metal prices remain high and global demand continues to rise, this crime is big business and an issue that will not disappear on its own.

"The summer holiday season will see many buildings, particularly schools and offices, left vulnerable to both the organized and opportunistic thief. Thieves are not invisible unless we choose to ignore them," commented Kathy Burke, volunteer chair of Sussex Crimestoppers.

"Metal theft is the hot topic today," she continued. "We read about incidents in the papers and many of us may well have felt the impact of metal theft on our day to day lives: train cancellations from cable and track theft, loss of phone and internet connection, school closures. However, awareness of metal theft is only part of the battle. In order to stop

criminals continuing to disrupt our lives we all need to be proactive, vigilant and to report our suspicions quickly. To this end Crimestoppers offers the public a safe and anonymous way to stop the thieves by contacting us on 0800 555 111 or using our secure, online form direct from a mobile phone at www.crimestoppers-uk.org. But we can only be effective if you make that call."

Last week Police Forces in the South East introduced a new scheme named Operation Tornado. This will make it easier to trace any person who sells metal to Scrap Metal Merchants and will help to remove and prosecute dealers of stolen metal. Crimestoppers will be working throughout the year to further enhance and support this initiative.

Inspector Martin Pattenden, the Sussex Police lead for Operation Tornado remarked: "As a Force we are committed to reducing metal theft in Sussex. Operation Tornado aims to target unscrupulous dealers rather than inhibit legitimate businesses. However we still need intelligence from the public to tackle this crime from all angles and the Crimestoppers anonymous service provides a valuable tool to enable communities to provide information safely and free from fear."
