The Freedom of Self - forgetfulness.

Over the holiday period I read a very short book by Timothy Keller called 'The freedom of self-forgetfulness'. It speaks of the Church in Corinth and the divisions it was experiencing due to members of the congregation aligning themselves with particular leaders and teachers; in this case Paul, Peter and Apollos. To restore harmony and peace Paul urges them not to boast or take pride in one man over another.

In essence he was speaking about the problem of self-esteem. Up until the 20th Century traditional cultures always believed that too high a view of yourself was the root cause of all the evil in the world. But in our modern western culture our belief is that people misbehave for lack of self-esteem because they have too low a view of themselves.

Paul is trying to teach the church about pride and the human ego. He uses the Greek word *physioo* for pride which literally means 'overinflated, swollen and ready to burst' and this he says is the condition of the human ego.

In his book 'Sickness unto Death', Soren Kierkegaard says 'it is the normal state of the human heart to try and build its identity around something besides God. Spiritual pride is the illusion that we are competent to run our own lives, achieve our own sense of self-worth and find a purpose big enough to give us meaning to life without God'.

The problem is, only God can fill the vastness of the human heart, everything else we try to pour in, whether it be achievement, looks, power or money - all these things only rattle around - the insatiable ego is never satisfied.

It is like being in a court room - everyday our identities are on trial and everything we do is providing evidence for the prosecution or evidence for the defence. Some days we feel that we are winning the trial and other days we feel that we are losing it. It is a sorry state of affairs and a no-win situation which steals much of our joy. The atheist might say that they get their self-image from being a good person. They are a good person and they hope eventually they will get a verdict that confirms that they are a good person. Performance leads to verdict. For the Buddhist too, performance leads to verdict. If you are a Muslim, performance leads to verdict. But who wants to live in a state of continual anxiety that you may never measure up, no matter what you do?

However, Paul says that he has found the secret. The trial is over for him, he is out of the courtroom. How could this be?

If you look at the life of St Paul you would quickly realise that before his conversion on the road to Damascus that he was a mess, an angry man who thought that it was right and part of his religious duty to persecute believers in Christ even to death.

Paul actually describes himself as the 'chief of sinners' and he knows that he cannot possibly justify himself. In looking to the Cross of Christ and identifying with Jesus as the sin bearer, not just for himself, but all of us, he walks away a free man; forgiven and the burden of guilt washed away.

He says that it is God who judges him and it is only His opinion that *ultimately* counts. The final verdict rests with God and God says that he's OK and the void in Paul's heart, once virtually empty, is now totally filled with the love of God.

After his conversion Paul never had a problem with his ego. In fact he says he doesn't much care what people think about him or even what he thinks about himself; how liberating is that? That's why the Gospel, the Good News of Christ is so countercultural in that you get the positive verdict before the performance.

In all other areas of life, job or religion you have to perform and keep on performing to get the verdict. All this means is that every day you are back in the courtroom trying to measure up to your own or other people's standards. In Christianity the situation is reversed and the verdict leads to performance.

If you get the revelation of what God was doing through Christ you can actually lightenup on yourself and start to live a life of freedom and less stress because life is not all about you! With this in mind you can actually do things for the simple joy of doing them.

Timothy Keller writes 'I can start to enjoy things that are not about me, my work is not about me, my romance is not about me, my dating is not about me. This is Gospel humility, blessed self-forgetfulness. Not thinking more of myself as in modern cultures, or less of myself as in traditional cultures. Simply thinking of myself, less.

May God's blessing be upon everyone in the Parish.

Urgent churchyard appeal

St Thomas à Becket Church, Framfield has a large and much-loved churchyard which, over recent years, has been very well managed and is now home to an amazing diversity of flora and wildlife.

However, it has recently been confirmed that three ash trees in our churchyard are suffering from Ash Dieback, a serious disease that is currently sweeping the UK. It is caused by a fungus that blocks the trees' water transport systems causing leaf loss, lesions in the wood and on the bark and, ultimately, the dieback of the tree's crown.

The affected trees in our churchyard are now a hazard to both people and property. One tree, situated close to a large stained glass window in the church, needs early attention. The cost of removing these trees will be around £800 to £1000 and we would welcome your support to enable the work to be carried out with some urgency.

Nature Notes



Building through Blessing in Blackboys and Beyond

New Life is a small thriving Church with a desire to grow both in depth and number. At our heart we are a family of people, young and old, who are seeking to deepen our relationship with God, one another and with the people we come alongside in our day to day lives. We are a new congregation formed just over 5 years ago but are part of the Baptist Union of Great Britain a network of over 2000 churches which has its roots back in the 17th Century.

We gather together for a weekly service on Sunday mornings at Blackboys village hall starting with coffee and cake at 10.30am. The last Sunday of the month is always an All Age Service often followed by lunch. We also have a Sunday evening prayer meeting and Life Groups which meet during the week.

We hope that you will find our church family relaxed, informal and friendly yet with a desire to live our faith in a way that is authentic and real. It would be great to meet you sometime and if you have any queries don't hesitate to contact me, we could always meet in the Grove for a coffee and a chat.

And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:8)

Early this morning I was privileged to see 2 black storks flying over fields near our house in France on their way to Africa. These are rare, shy birds that nest atop tall trees in remote northern Eurasian forests. Recently, I have also seen white storks going the same way. White storks are not shy, however, and tend to nest on church towers and other high buildings, trees and pylons across Europe, but only rarely in Britain. Also, I've seen wheatears passing to a similar destination from northern latitudes. Pied and spotted flycatchers have been sallying forth from our elm trees to catch flying insects on the wing as they sojourn before flying to West Africa. Swallows and other hirundines have also been gathering on overhead cables ready to fly as far as South Africa. These are in turn hunted by a small falcon called the hobby.

Chiffchaffs, a type of small leaf warbler, still sing their name as they migrate south, past where we are. You may also hear them in Sussex as they head for the coast and beyond. Chattering starlings are also gathering. They do not usually migrate far, but they can form vast flocks that fly at sunset wheeling and diving like a single organism, often chattering as they do so, in an aerial dance called a murmoration.

It is not often realised that some butterflies also migrate south in the autumn. One of these is the painted lady. Painted ladies donate their Latin names to humans as they are in the genus *Vanessa* and the sub-genus *Cynthia*. Apparently, they often fly south to Africa in the autumn and back to Europe in the spring. Considering that they cross the English Channel, the continent, then the Mediterranean followed by the Sahara Desert, it is an incredible journey for a tiny butterfly. Some may be taken in flight by insectivorous birds making the same journey, but others clearly succeed as the annual routine continues.

There is a plant that is also a harbinger of autumn that also has a feminine name and that is autumn ladies tresses. This is a delicate white orchid that can turn up almost anywhere, but usually in low numbers. Like most orchids, the seeds are profuse but tiny, like grains of dust and settle everywhere, but only a few survive to flower. I have even seen them flowering in Manor Park, Uckfield. They are fairly frequent on the chalk Sussex Downs where the grass is short. Their charming Latin name is *Spiranthes spiralis*.

WDC has declared a climate emergency and is embarking on a series of actions where it can make a difference. Full details of the strategies WDC will be putting in place can be found on their website.



FRAMFIELD PARISH COUNCIL - REPORT

Although it has been holiday time, the Parish Council always seems to continue to be making improvements across the Parish.

The new basketball area on Framfield recreation ground is now complete – the frame itself was kindly donated by Heathfield & Waldron Parish Council and some of the groundworks funded by a grant but the majority was funded by Trust funds.

The works behind the Memorial Hall are now also complete. The resurfacing really does look marvellous and is all down to a local firm. A sign has been erected at the back of the Hall if you want to know who they are for any future works. We can recommend them.

Dialogue is still and always will be ongoing with ESCC on the many and varied Highways-related issues within the Parish. Pump Lane has recently been re-surfaced, this is after many years of 'negotiation' with ESCC. The total re-surfacing of Mount Pleasant is also still high up on the agenda.

As reported last time, the new bench has been installed outside the Hare & Hounds.



The Community Hub

.....the place to meet

In April, Action in Rural Sussex (AirS) invited local residents to an open morning at The Grove Cafe to ask their views on the development of a Community Hub in Blackboys. AirS is an independent charity that represents people living in rural Sussex and supports them to overcome a range of challenges that rural living can present. The Village Agent Team supports communities to work together to overcome these challenges. Suzi Lock, the village agent and community development worker for Framfield and Blackboys is helping us to set up our Community Hub.

The open morning was well attended and residents were keen to use The Grove as a base for a Community Hub. They proposed a wide range of events that they would like to see happening at the Hub: keep fit activities, book club, photography club, women's groups, foreign language conversation, walking group, music groups, quiz nights and supper evenings.

Blackboys resident Sharon Burt has agreed to be a voluntary administrator for the Hub and to work with residents to put their ideas into action. So far there are two Hub activities already up and running at The Grove: every Tuesday, 11am, Elevenses - an opportunity to meet with others who live in the area; every 1st Wednesday of the month, 10.30am, Book Club – come and pick up this month's book, discuss last month's book and anything else you have read. We are also in the process of putting together a Community Library at The Grove. LIVING WITH FUR AND FEATHER

RESTRICTING THE USE OF FIREWORKS

As many of you have pets that are frightened of fireworks I thought I would look up when they could be used and decided to write to my member of parliament and thought you might like to know what I said

"I have been working as a dog and cat behaviourist for many years and know the fear and distress caused by fireworks to dogs, cats and other animals. This is also having an adverse effect on the owners.

I thought the law was restricting the use of fireworks but am horrified and shocked to discover that fireworks are allowed every day of the year including Sundays from 7am to 11pm

On Bonfire night they are allowed until midnight, also they are allowed until 1am on the 31 Dec for New Year's Eve, 11 Dec for Diwali and on 8 Feb for the Chinese New Year.

As you can see there is no respite from the fireworks at any time; the only safe time to let the cat out or walk the dog would be from about 6am to 7am.

I have helped people over many years with their distressed pets. If you know in advance that there will be noisy fireworks on one particular date it is possible to make preparations to calm the animal within the home and also, most importantly to keep pets indoors. I know there have been tragic accidents where terrified pets have run away to be lost, killed or injured.

Please can you do something to restrict the number of days and hours fireworks are allowed. I would also like to ban the bangs as it is mainly the noise which is causing so much distress."

I have written articles before on how to keep your pets calm during firework displays but this is impossible if you do not know when they are going to be on. Fireworks are not allowed for people under eighteen and are not allowed to be let off in public places, but we know that some are let off maliciously to frighten animals.

May I suggest if you feel strongly about the firework situation you also write to your member of parliament?
